
## **CLIMATE CLEVER REPORT 2021**

Following extensive research, pilots, tonnes of carbon savings and hundreds of thousands of dollars of utility savings, the ClimateClever Initiative empowers schools and students all over Australia to reduce their carbon footprint and save money.

#### **OVERVIEW**

Gas

Our continued focus on sustainability at North Morley Primary School with the support of City of Stirling's Living Green Schools Program has seen a **reduction in our carbon emissions by 11%** as compared to last year.


Waste

6.47 t-CO2e

Compared to last year we have **saved \$11,373.80** in utilities costs, with our biggest saving coming in water costs.




We have seen reductions in usage across all areas. Electricity we saved 5,728.13 kilowatts (6% reduction); gas we saved 24,358.67 megajoules (40% reduction); water we saved 211.77 kilolitres (13% reduction); and waste we saved 3.07 tonnes to landfill (32% reduction).




#### **WASTE**

Since 2018 we have reduced our waste usage from 32 tonnes to 6.47 tonnes. Due to a waste audit in March 2019 and the introduction of our Community Recycling Hub and the investment in green waste and comingled recycling bins from Suez, we have seen a significant reduction in our landfill waste usage and ultimately our carbon emissions have more than halved.

- Recycling poster for fridge sent home with every family



#### **WATER**


Bringing our water use down is an ongoing challenge but our water usage shows a steady reduction in kilolitres used each year since 2019.



- Water Wise School accreditation in 2020
- Water wise drip irrigation installed to Bush Tucker Garden in 2021

#### GAS


Our gas consumption at North Morley is closely tied to the seasons due to our classroom heating systems being our main gas usage. However, our gas usage has reduced significantly in the past year.



Living Green Schools Program - North Morley Primary School


#### **ELECTRICITY**

Our electricity consumption accounts for the large majority of our carbon footprint at North Morley. Although we have seen a general reduction in electricity use since 2019, June and July this year had excessively high usage rates.



#### **ACTIONS COMPLETED**

- Power Rangers student team established in Term 3, 2021
- Switch off lights campaign started
- 12 new LED lights installed when old lights required replacing





#### **SUMMARY**

ClimateClever continues to be a useful tool to record and track data directly linked to our activities which impact our carbon footprint. As our students take more ownership of these sustainability initiatives, they can take a more active role in using the computer application and monitoring our goals.

We look forward to having a big focus on electricity in 2022 so we can further reduce our school's carbon footprint!
